The 3237th session of the Council of the European Union - **AGRICULTURE and FISHERIES** - will take place on Monday and Tuesday 13-14 May 2013 (10.00) in the Justus Lipsius building in Brussels, under the presidency of **Mr Simon Coveney, Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine of Ireland**.
